The City Commissioners finally voted 5-0 to suspend and not terminate this relationship.

We had a lovely luncheon in March to celebrate Vickie Oldham, CEO of the Sarasota African American Cultural Coalition, and her Newtown Alive initiative. After learning about Sarasota's African-American pioneers and history, SCAS members took a trolley tour through Newtown and the Rosemary District, which African-Americans call Overtown. We heard stories of brave civil rights initiatives and their unsung heroes: forward-thinking citizens who helped found and enrich Sarasota.

We hope you will attend our next Bird Key Yacht Club luncheon, "A Walk in the Park," on April 20th at 11:30 am, with Bill Waddill, COO of the Bay Park Conservancy. The organization's goal is to implement a plan for the 53-acre Sarasota Bayfront area that will establish a cultural and economic legacy for the region while ensuring open, public access to the Bayfront.

On May 18th at 11:30 am we will have our Annual Meeting at Bird Key Yacht Club, at which the membership is invited to partake in our luncheon and then vote. At the same time we will be hosting a joint event with the Swiss-American Club: "Swiss Culture: The Land of Milk & Money," featuring British travel writer and Swiss resident Diccon Bewes. Unfortunately, the Mayor in Mérida, Mexico, has postponed the "Week in Mérida" pop-up exhibit that was supposed to take place in the end of May to an as-yet unscheduled date.

Newtown and Overtown Come Alive

On March 16 th Sister Cities Association of Sarasota hosted storyteller and historian Vickie Oldham, President/CEO of the Sarasota African American Cultural Coalition, at a luncheon to discuss Newtown Alive. This fascinating initiative memorializes and bring to life a significant African-American community in Sarasota and the people who blazed a trail to create its full-bodied cultural history in the face of multiple challenges such as prejudice and segregation.

Oldham, along with singer and former Marvelette Brenda Watty and Walter Gilbert, Senior Director of Diversity and Inclusion at Marie Selby Botanical Gardens, illustrated how the Newtown Alive project presents this community today as it thrives and changes in reaction to new challenges and possibilities.

Their thoughtful, uplifting presentation combined with song and a Q and A session gave a diverse audience of SCAS members a fresh perspective on a long-overlooked part of Sarasota's history. In attendance was former SCAS One World Award winner April Glasco, founder of Second Chance/Last Opportunity, an organization that helps an underserved community learn life skills and receive support to better their situations.

On April 7th multiple attendees at the luncheon rejoined Oldham, Watty, and Gilbert, along with longtime Sarasota resident Odessa Butler, on a trolley tour that took them from the Leonard Reid House through notable streets of Newtown and Overtown. The latter, primarily African-American district, has recently become gentrified as the current Rosemary District. The trolley tour is helping to celebrate its African-American roots as Sarasota residents enjoy a more complex view of Sarasota.

Brenda Watty led SCAS members in song several times during the tour to lift spirits and celebrate fellowship. This journey was helpful for the SCAS membership to envision the rich cultural heritage on display in Oldtown before its current, slicker iteration. We heard about Sarasota's actions during the civil rights movement as Sarasota community leaders, such as Walter Gilbert himself, a past Sarasota NAACP president, stood up against injustice. He led the initiative for single member district voting.

The tour leaders recounted activists' earlier protests to desegregate county beaches with "wade-ins." Newtown residents resisted diverse Jim Crow—era injustices. The tour passed by community cornerstones and revered symbols of hope such as the Payne Chapel AME Church, which just turned ninety-four this April; Greater Hurst Chapel AME, and Bethlehem Bible Church.
