What Makes Sarasota Sister City Tel Mond, Israel So Special


In October, Rabbi Jonathan R. Katz shared a Zoom presentation, "What Makes Sarasota Sister City Tel Mond, Israel So Special," sponsored by Temple Emanu-El's Israel Committee. He discussed the community's history and showed photos of prominent sites, picturesque streetscapes, and homes.

Established as an agricultural settlement in 1929 for the cultivation of citrus orchards, Tel Mond (population 10,000) is centrally located 25 minutes northwest of Tel Aviv and fifty minutes south of Haifa. It is regarded as one of Israel's most desirable places to live, prompting many of the nation's leading high-tech executives to call it home.

Possessing excellent schools and an active community center, its library is named for legendary Sarasota philanthropists Alex and Betty Schoenbaum. Like Sarasota, the city supports a range of cultural interests and has a considerable senior citizen and ex-pat population. Since Tel Mond became a Sarasota Sister City in 1999, several student exchanges, group visits, and joint civic projects have been undertaken.

Temple Emanu-El and Sister Cities Association of Sarasota members offered interesting anecdotes about their own Israel travel experiences. The Temple's Judith Koziol conveyed how much she personally derived from her involvement with Richmond, Virginia's sister city in Israel, which just happens to be located fairly close to Tel Mond.

Linda Rosenbluth spoke of early visits to Tel Mond more than thirty years ago before the settlement had paved roads. Alice Cotman displayed embroidered artwork from Tel Mond while Kim Sheintal shared about a scrapbook of photos she prepared following a wonderful visit to Tel Mond several years ago.

THE "CASA MERIDA" PROJECT

We continued talks with our friends from the City Hall of Mérida for the future during our monthly Zoom meeting.

The "Casa Mérida" project is a pilot project in the United States with Sarasota being the first city to host this type of event. The "Casa Mérida" project (a pop-up event) will exhibit plastic arts, handcrafts, gastronomy, jewelry, stone, and wood art in Sarasota, where attendees may have the opportunity to buy some of the products. The "Casa Mérida" project will be hosted by Selby Library for one week at the end of May 2022. This project has now been named **"Mérida's Week in Sarasota."** It will be an honor to have the mayor of Mérida, Renán Barrera, come to Sarasota for the project to work on future agreements with the Chamber of Commerce, Tourism and Education. The mayor is pursuing scholarship agreements abroad.
