THE “CASA MERIDA” PROJECT

Sister Cities Association of Sarasota is working with our Sister City of Mérida, México in partnership with the Ringling Museum, Visit Sarasota, and Selby Library to bring the project “Casa Mérida” to Sarasota. At the end of August, we visited the Selby Library and were given a tour by the manager Steven Thomas, Jennifer Perry, Public Services Manager, and her assistant. The meeting was attended by Miriam Kramer, Mike Fehily and Grisell Alemán. They kindly showed us the facilities and were very excited to support and be part of the “Casa Mérida” project. The library offered to lend us the facilities for a month in the first quarter of 2022. They are offering us usage of the two floors of the library for the exhibition of this project. The Selby Library typically receives 700 to 1,200 visitors a day or approximately 15,000 to 20,000 a month (pre-Covid). The Selby Library is the perfect location for this project because it’s very well located in the heart of downtown Sarasota and has ample parking. We are just waiting on confirmation of the dates to start figuring out logistics and advertising for the “Casa Mérida” project.
